<p>Practice Update</p> <p>Doctorlink</p> <p>Online Access workshops</p> <p>Mental Health Workshops</p>	<p>Doctorlink New app/online service for patients wishing to access same day appointments. Patients register via the app, sign in and complete a symptom checker. Depending on the outcome the patient will be signposted to a relevant service including local pharmacies, a&e or GP surgery. If it is indicated that you require a GP appointment you will be offered an appointment within the appropriate timescale or advised to contact the surgery. A summary of your encounter will be sent directly to the surgery and filed in your electronic medical record.</p> <p>The practice will soon be going live with Video consultations, allowing patients to see their GP without leaving the house/office.</p> <p>Online access workshops We are hoping to host a number of online access workshops to assist patients with registration and navigating the apps. We are keen for the PPG members to be involved supporting other patients and promoting the online services. Lyn and Irena volunteered to host.
